

# Fast Fashion and Its Environmental Impact February 2025 Lesson Plan: Elementary

**Grade Level:** Elementary School

**Duration:** 60 minutes + Extension Activities

Objective: Students will understand the concept of fast fashion and how reusing and

repurposing clothing helps the environment.

#### **Materials Needed**

Pictures of clothing production and waste (printouts or slides)

- Sample thrifted or repurposed items
- Art supplies (markers, scissors, fabric scraps, glue, etc.)
- Large paper for group activities
- Music for the fashion show

#### **Lesson Outline**

## Introduction (10 minutes)

## 1. Warm-Up Question:

 Ask: "Where do your clothes come from?" and "What do you do with clothes you don't wear anymore?"

# 2. Introduce Fast Fashion:

- Explain:
  - Fast fashion is when clothes are made quickly and cheaply so people can buy a lot of them.
  - This can be bad for the Earth because it creates too much trash, uses a lot of water, and sometimes people who make the clothes aren't treated fairly.
  - If appropriate, play a video from YouTube that illustrates the issue: <u>The Fast Fashion Problem Behind the News</u> (This video is probably best for 4th and 5th graders).
- Show pictures of landfills filled with clothing and factories where clothes are made.

# Main Activity: Learning About Reuse (20 minutes)

# 1. Discussion:

Why is it better to reuse clothes or buy second-hand?



- Less trash in the Earth
- Saves resources like water and energy
- Helps people get creative and unique outfits

# 2. Hands-On Group Activity:

- o Divide students into small groups.
- o Give each group fabric scraps, markers, and paper.
- Challenge: Design a piece of clothing or accessory using the materials. Draw or create a small prototype.

# **Eco-Challenge: Second-Hand Fashion Show (25 minutes)**

#### 1. Preparation:

- Each student or group brings in a thrifted or repurposed clothing item from home or uses provided materials.
- Decorate or style the item with a creative twist.

## 2. Showcase:

- Students explain their creations:
  - "I used this because..."
  - "This helps the Earth by..."
- Hold a mini-fashion show in class, playing music as students walk and show their designs.

# Wrap-Up (5 minutes)

## 1. Closing Discussion:

- Ask: "What did you learn today about clothes and the Earth?"
- Reinforce: Reusing clothes helps the planet, and everyone can make a difference by being creative and thoughtful.

## 2. Extension Idea:

 Encourage students to share the lesson at home by helping their families donate clothes or visit a thrift store.

# **Optional Extension Activities**

- Art Project: Create posters promoting thrift shopping or upcycling.
- **Math Connection:** Calculate how much water is saved by reusing a shirt instead of buying a new one.
- Literature Tie-In: Read books like "What a Waste: Trash, Recycling, and Protecting Our Planet" by Jess French.



# **Assessment**

- Participation in the discussion and activities.
- Creativity and effort in the Eco-Challenge fashion show.
- Students' ability to explain how their designs help the environment.
